Charity is an important concern that we, as Masons, are often reminded to consider. We have The Masonic Home of Virginia, Grand Lodge Relief Fund, Grand Lodge Scholarships, the Scottish Rite Language Clinics, Shriners Hospitals, the George Washington Masonic National Memorial, the Collingwood Library, Lodge youth scholarship programs, and several other charities. But what is true Masonic charity? True Masonic charity goes far beyond writing a check or volunteering time to support the philanthropic institutions of Masonry. True charity, like true Masonry, is first found in one's heart.

True Masonic charity is priceless, yet it costs not a dime. More than that, it pays greater dividends than any investment plan or charitable trust. If you are fortunate enough to be in the presence of great Masons, you may have seen Masonic charity in action.

Masonic charity takes place when a Mason has superior knowledge, talent, or ability but chooses to recognize and hold up for all to see, a brother who has perhaps achieved less, but in that achievement given everything he had. After all, which is the more charitable, a rich man giving \$1,000 or a poor man giving all he has although it may be but pocket change? This example we easily recognize as it deals with a commodity we deal in daily. However, we may neglect to apply this wise lesson in charity to more abstract situations.

The next time you feel inclined to take up argument with a less informed but well meaning Brother or feel you must correct a Masonic Veteran who has misspoken; stop, count to ten, and ask yourself "is this an opportunity to grow toward being a great Mason? Is this a time for true Masonic charity?"

# Home's Admissions Policies Enhanced

After a thorough analysis of possible alternatives to more effectively utilize vacant rooms at the Masonic Home, the Board of Governors, at its December, 2006 meeting, has modified the admission requirements for **PAYING residents, including those who choose to live in the Masonic Village.**

Effective immediately, any member in good standing of a Virginia Lodge may apply as a PAYING resident of the Masonic Home. For PAYING residents, there will no longer be a requirement that a Mason be a member for a certain number of years.

Furthermore, there will no longer be a mandatory escrow required of PAYING residents. All applications as PAYING residents will continue to be subject to a review of the health and financial situation of the applicant, to insure that applicable regulatory guidelines and financial safeguards are met.

For several years, the Home has experienced vacancies on a regular basis. Every empty room represents lost revenue which could be used to support our primary mission of caring for the REGULAR resident population. There have been NO changes in the admissions requirements for REGULAR residents.

REGULAR RESIDENTS are those who apply to the Home, but cannot pay the entire cost of their care. Instead, REGULAR applicants turn over to the Home their real estate, life insurance, and only 75% of their other assets and income. In exchange, the Home agrees to care for them for the rest of their life.

The many charitable gifts donated by Masons and our friends go directly to support these REGULAR residents.

Since our primary focus will continue to be on REGULAR residents, the Home will attempt to keep a "supply" of rooms available at all times for REGULAR residents.

These changes in admissions, targeted solely to PAYING residents, are designed to make it easier for Virginia Masons, especially new Virginia Masons, to join the wonderful community of the Masonic Home of Virginia. The changes are intended to remove obstacles which might have hindered PAYING applicants from joining the community.

Currently, several rooms are available in the Home and two beautiful cottages are available in the Masonic Village.
